

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Neck scarf

Measurements: approx 22cm max width approx 140cm length
Skill Level: easy

How much yarn: 4 balls (each ball 50g and 125m) of New Baby Alpaca 70 yarn (70% Baby Alpaca, 30% Extrafine Merino Wool), shade no. 30193

Needles: A pair of 6.00mm knitting needles

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point

STITCHES

Using needles: tubular st - Garter stitch (g st)

TENSION

17 sts and 27 rows measure 10cm square over garter st with 3.75mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

With 7.00 mm needles cast on 7 sts and work as follows: 3 sts in tubular st, 1 st in garter st and 3 sts in tubular st. Inside first 3 sts, inc 1 st (to increase, make 1 st as follows: pick up horizontal yarn between last st and next st and knit into the back of it) on next and every following 4th row 34 times. There are 41 sts. Now the work is approx 50cm long from beg. Cont to work straight 20cm more, then, inside the 3 tubular sts, on RH (right hand) side dec 1 st on next and every following 4th row 34 times. When work measures 140cm, cast off rem 7 sts.

Dome Cap

Size: one size -Skill Level: intermediate

How much yarn: 1 ball (50g and 90m) of Maxi Soft yarn (100% Extrafine Merino Wool) for each of the following shades: no. 13277 light green and natural no. 978

Needles: A pair of 5.50mm knitting needles **Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point

STITCHES

Using needles: tubular stitch.

FISHERMAN'S RIB: (work over an odd number of sts)

1st row: K1, * yarn forward and round needle (= yfrn), slip
1 stitch purlways, K1; rep from * to end. 2nd row: P1, * K2tog
(slipped st+yfrn), P1; rep from * to end. Rep 1st and 2nd
rows throughout.

TENSION

14 sts measure 10cm in width over Fisherman's rib with 5.50 mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

With light green cast on 63 sts and work 4 rows in tubular st for border. Cont in Fisherman's rib alternating colours as follows: 2 rows with light green, 18 rows with cream, 2 rows with light green, 2 rows with cream and continue with light green to end. At the same time, when work measures approx 17cm and 52 rows have been worked from border, decrease as follows: Next row (RS): K2, * SK2P (= slip 1 st, knit 2 sts together, pass slipped st over K2 tog), K5; rep from * to last 4 sts: SK2P and K2 (16 sts have been decreased). Rep these decs, above previous, every other row twice more. At end (approx 19cm from beg) cut yarn leaving a long end, insert into a yarn needle, then through rem 15 sts on knitting needle. Pull yarn to close top, then secure yarn on wrong side (WS) with small stitches. Then sew side seam.

Three coloured beanie

Size: one size - Skill Level: intermediate

How much yarn: 1 ball (50g and 50m) of Natura yarn (40% Extrafine Merino Wool, 35% Cotton, 25% Baby Alpaca) for each of the following shades: no. 30472 orange, no. 30231 dark green and no. 30232 light green Needles: A pair of 6.00mm knitting needles

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point

Other items: A small label (optional)

STITCHES

Using needles: K1, P1 rib.

TENSION

13 sts and 16 rows measure 10cm square over K1, P1 rib with 6.00 mm needles (without widening rib). Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

With dark green cast on 61 sts and work in K1, P1 rib alternating colours as follows: 24 rows with dark green, 11 rows with orange and continue with light green to end. At the same time, when work measures approx 21cm and 34 rows have been worked from border, decrease as follows: **Next row (RS):** K4, * SK2P (= slip 1 st, knit 2 sts together, pass slipped st over K2 tog), K5; rep from * ending with K1 (14 sts have been decreased). Rep these decs, above previous, every other row twice more. Work 1 row, then on next row (RS) work * SKIP (= slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over K1); rep from * to end. When work measures approx 26cm from beg, cut yarn leaving a long end, insert into a yarn needle, then through rem 10 sts on knitting needle. Pull yarn to close top, then secure yarn on wrong side (WS) with small stitches. Continue sewing side seam. With light green yarn make a pompom 9cm in diameter and sew it at beanie top. Sew label (optional) as shown in picture.

Bamboo handle bag

Measurements: approx 30cm maximum width and 24cm height, measured from the finished front panel; side gussets 7cm and base 11cm.

Skill Level: intermediate

How much yarn: 10 balls (each ball 50g and 125m) of Merinocot yarn (53% Extrafine Merino Wool, 47% Cotton) whose 9 balls in shade no. 14594 cyclamen and 1 ball shade no. 19063 purple

Hook: A 3.75mm crochet hook

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point **Other items:** Bamboo handle. Golden closure Plasticized net

STITCHES

Chain (ch) - Slip sitch (ss) - double crochet (dc)

TENSION

17 sts and 20 rows measure 10cm square over double crochet with 3.75 mm crochet hook and two strands of yarn held together. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

Note: work with two strands of yarn held together.

Front panel: with cyclamen yarn ch32 and work a row of 31 dc. Continue in dc, inc 1 st at each end every row 9 times: for inc, work 2 dc into same st. There are 49 sts. On 15th row (= approx 7cm from beg) dec 1 st at each end: for dec, work 2 dc closed together. Rep these decs every following 5th row 4 more times, then on following 3rd row once: 37 sts remain. When work measures approx 22cm from beg and 44 rows have been worked, fasten off. With purple yarn, finish panel working a round of dc all around all sides, then work 2 rows dc only along sides and base. Fasten off.

Back panel with flap: with cyclamen work as Front panel until to 44th row. Continue for flap: work other 32 rows (= 16cm), then dec 1 st at each end every row 9 times. Across 6th row, create a central eyelet: work 3 ch instead of 3 centre sts and miss the 3 sts of previous row. At end of work (approx 21cm), fasten off. With purple yarn, finish panel and flap working a round of dc all around. Fasten off.

Base and side gussets: for first half part, with cyclamen ch8 and work a row of 7 dc. Continue in dc, inc 1 st at each end every 8th row 4 times: there are 15 dc. Cont to work straight until reaching the center of the panels (check the measurement by placing the work on panel), then work other half part as previous but in mirrored shape. Fasten off. With purple yarn, finish this stripe working a round of dc all around. Fasten off.

FINISHING

Compose the bag, joining all parts with ss and purple yarn. Fix the handle, in the center of the thickness of the flap and a part of the closure around the central eyelet. At about 10 cm from the base and in the center of the front panel, in correspondence with the eyelet, fix the other part of the closure. Fix the plasticized net inside the bag and in correspondence with the handle to make it more rigid.

Pompom beanie

Size: one size

Skill Level: intermediate

How much yarn: 1 ball (25g and 75m) of Prestige yarn (100% Cashmere) in shade no. 14594

Needles: A pair of 6.00mm knitting needles

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point

Other items: A large fake fur pompom

STITCHES

Using needles: Tubular stitch EXCHANGED BRIOCHE STITCH: (work on even sts)

1st row: (WS) K to end. **2nd row:** 1 selvedge st, * yarn forward and round needle (= yfrn), slip 1 stitch purlways, K1; rep from * ending with 1 selvedge st. **3rd row:** 1 selvedge st, * K1, K2tog (slipped st+yfrn); rep from * ending with 1 selvedge st. **4th row:** 1 selvedge st, K1, * yfrn, slip 1 stitch purlways, K1; rep from * to last 2 sts, yfrn and 1 selvedge st. **5th row:** 1 selvedge st, K2tog (slipped st+yfrn); * K1, K2tog (slipped st+yfrn); rep from * to last 2 sts, K1 and 1 selvedge st. Rep from 2nd to 5th row throughout.

TENSION

10cm worked in exchanged brioche st with 6mm needles measure 13cm in width. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

Cast on 60 sts and, for border, work 6 rows in tubular st. Cont to work in Exchanged brioche st. When work measures approx 13cm and 34 rows have been worked from border, decrease as follows: **Next row (RS):** K2, * SK2P (= slip 1 st, knit 2 sts together, pass slipped st over K2 tog), K5; rep from * ending with K2 (14 sts have been decreased). Rep these decs, above previous, every 4th row twite more. Work 1 row, then on next row (RS) work 7 decs using SK1P (= slip 1 st, knit 1 st, pass slipped st over K1) instead of SK2P every time. When work measures approx 19cm from beg, cut yarn leaving a long end, insert into a yarn needle, then through rem 11 sts on knitting needle. Pull yarn to close top, then secure yarn on wrong side (WS) with small stitches. Continue sewing side seam. Sew pompom to beanie top.

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Trunk Bag

Measurements: approx 25 wide and 12cm high, with side gusset 10cm, when the bag is closed.

Skill Level: intermediate

How much yarn: 6 balls (each ball 50g and 125m) of Merinocot yarn (53% Extrafine Merino Wool, 47% Cotton) in shade no. 14669

Hook: A 3.75mm crochet hook

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point Other items: Golden chain shoulder strap with fastening snap hooks. Golden closure. Plasticized net

STITCHES

Chain (ch) - Double crochet (dc) - Ridge double CRO-CHET BACK (RDCB): work dc inserting hook into back loop only of previous row

TENSION

18 sts and 21 rows measure 10cm square over double crochet with 3.75 mm crochet hook and two strands of yarn held together. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

Note: work using 2 strands of yarn held together **Base:** ch16 and work a row of 15 dc. Continue to work rows of dc, until work measures 24cm from beg. Now work a round of dc all around. Fasten off.

Front panel and side gussets: work along 3 sides of the base: 15 dc across a short side, 1 dc into corner, 48 dc across a long side, 1 dc into next corner and 15 dc across other short side. There are 80 dc. Continue to work rows of dc, until work measures 10cm from beg. Fasten off.

Back panel with flap: make a magic ring and work 5 dc into ring. Pull yarn to close ring. Cont to work back-andforth rows of Ridge dc Back, working 3 RdcB into central st every row. When work measures 26cm from beg, work a round RdcB all around, then work another round RdcB but in correspondence of upper edge, create a central eyelet: work 3 ch instead of 3 centre sts and miss the 3 sts of previous row. Work other 4 rounds RdcB, then fasten off.

FINISHING

Sew the back panel with flap to base and along gusset sides. Fix the chain shoulder strap, in the center of the gusset, approx 7cm from base, then sew a part of the closure around the central eyelet. At center of the front panel, in correspondence with the eyelet, sew the other part of the closure. Fix the plasticized net inside the bag and under the flap to make it more rigid.

Shoulder bag

Measurements: approx 28cm wide, 20cm high and 12cm side gussets. - **Skill Level:** intermediate

How much yarn: 8 balls (each ball 50g and 91m) of Asian yarn (70% New Wool, 30% Acrylic Fiber Machine Washable) in shade no. 14202

Hook: A 5.50mm crochet hook. A 6.50mm crochet hook **Sewing needle:** Yarn needle with rounded point. **Other items:** 2 gold chain shoulder straps with screw

STITCHES

Chain (ch) - Double crochet (dc)
FISHERMAN'S RIB: (work over any number of sts)

fastening. A snap button. Plasticized net

Ist row: insert hook into 3rd ch from hook, draw yarn, yarn on hook and draw the yarn through the 2 loops on hook, * insert hook into side loop of stitch just worked and into next ch, draw yarn, yarn on hook and draw the yarn through the 3 loops on hook; rep from * to end; turn. **2nd row:** insert hook into back loop of 1st stitch of previous row, draw yarn, yarn on hook and draw the yarn through the 2 loops on hook, * insert hook into side loop of stitch just worked and into back loop of next st, draw yarn, yarn on hook and draw the yarn through the 3 loops on hook; rep from * to end working into both loops of last st. Rep 2nd row throughout.

TENSIONS

19 sts measure 10cm width over Fisherman's rib with 5.50 mm crochet hook and two strands of yarn held together. 12 sts measure 10cm width over double crochet with 6.50 mm crochet hook and two strands of yarn held together. Take time to check tensions before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

Note: work using 2 strands of yarn held together **Front and back panels with base:** with 5.50mm crochet hook ch90 and work 50cm in Fisherman's rib. Then work a round dc all around. Fasten off.

Side gussets: (make 2) with 6.50mm crochet hook ch13 and work a row of 12 dc. Cont to work rows of dc. When work measures 20cm from beg, fasten off.

FINISHING

Using crochet hook, join side gussets to base with a row of dc, taking both thicknesses. Complete opening with 2 rounds dc. Fasten off. Fix one of the two parts of snap button to the center of each bag panel, 2cm from upper edge. Fix the shoulder strap approx 4cm from upper edge of each panel, leaving 15cm free at center. Fix the plasticized net inside the bag and in correspondence with the base to make it more rigid.

Fedora Hat

Size: one size - Skill Level: intermediate

How much yarn: 3 balls (each ball 50g and 100m) of Everest yarn (95% Wool, 5% Viscose) shade no. 6014 **Hook:** A 4.50mm hook

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point

Other items: Stitch-markers

Galvanized wire rope for hat brim (optional)

STITCHES

Chain (ch) - Slip stitch (ss) Double crochet (dc)

TENSION

approx 17 sts and 19 rows measure 10cm square over double crochet with 4.50mm needles. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

Hat top - 1st Round: make a magic ring and into this ring work as follows: ch1 (that doesn't count ad st), 6 dc. At end of first round, pull yarn to close magic ring. Then continue in spiral pattern, as follows: you work the rounds continuously but without joining each round with a slip stitch, as the round continuing into the next round. Place 1 stitch-marker into first dc of each round to indicate beginning. 2nd round: 1 inc (= work 2 dc into same st) 6 times (= 12 dc). Move marker to first st of each round from here forward. 3rd round: (1 inc into next st, 1 dc into next st) 6 times (= 18 dc). 4th round: (1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 2 sts) 6 times (= 24 dc). 5th round: (1 inc into next st, 1 dc into each of next 3 sts) 6 times (there are 30 dc). 6th round: [1 inc (= work 2 dc into same st and place 1 stitch-marker into first dc), 1 dc into each of next 4 sts 6 times (= 36 dc). Hat piece should now have 6 marked stitches. These indicate the stitches to increase in moving forward. 7th round: (2 dc into marked st, 1 dc into each st to next marker) 6 times (= 42 dc). From 8th to 15th round: rep 7th round 8 more times. Hat piece should increase by 6 sts per round. At end of 15th round there are 90 sts. Circle should measure approx 16cm across. From 16th to **37st round:** 1 dc into each st. there are 90 dc. 38nd round: (2 dc into marked st, 1 dc into each of next 14 sts) 6 times (= 96 dc). Placing markers in increases is not necessary. Hat brim - Notes: this section contains increases every other row. Once markers are in place, move them up as each round is worked. For a less wavy and more rigid brim look, you can add optional wire rope in 14th round of brim. While rope isn't necessary, it will add extra stability and create a smoother-looking brim. **1st round:** [1 inc (= work 2 dc into next st and place 1 stitch-marker into first dc), 1 dc into each of next 7 sts | 12 times (= 108 dc). Hat should now have 12 marked stitches. 2nd round: 1 dc into each st. There are 108 sts. 3rd round: (2 dc into marked st, 1 dc into each st to next marker) 12 times (= 120 dc). From

4th to 13th round: rep 2nd and 3rd rounds 5 more times. At end of 13th round there are 180 sts. Note: if adding optional brim support, follow 14th round. If not adding brim support rep 2nd round once more and fasten off. 14th round: hold galvanized wire rope along 13th round. Crochet over it as you do in each st. Pause when 7.5cm remain unworked. Rub brim flat and try on hat to make sure density of stitches around rope is to your liking. (In order to get the flattest brim possible, avoid spreading stitches out too far. This can create a wavier brim.) Using wire cutters, snip rope so it overlaps itself by 5cm. Complete round by dc in each st, working over both ends of rope as you go. End with 1 ss into first st of round.

Fringed Scarf

Measurements: approx 32cm in width approx 200cm in length - **Skill Level:** intermediate

How much yarn: 11 balls (each ball 50g and 113m) of Calicò yarn (50% New Wool, 50% Acrylic) shade no. 13701

Needles: A pair of 7mm knitting needles

A double-pointed (Dp)needle

Sewing needle: Yarn needle with rounded point

STITCHES

Using needles: Garter stitch (g st)

Stocking stitch (st st)

RIGHT CABLE: (work over 16 sts)

1st row: P3, K10, P3. **2nd row and following even rows:** work sts as they appear. **3rd row:** P3, 10 Right crossed stitches (= place next 5 sts onto Dp needle, on backside, K next 5 sts, then K5 from Dp needle), P3. **5th and 7th rows:** P3, K10, P3. **8th row:** work sts as they appear. Rep these 8 rows throughout.

LEFT CABLE: (work over 16 sts)

1st row: P3, K10, P3. **2nd row and following even rows:** work sts as they appear. **3rd row:** P3, 10 Left crossed sts (= place 5 sts onto Dp needle, on frontside, K next 5 sts, then K5 from Dp needle), P3. **5th and 7th rows:** P3, K10, P3. **8th row:** work sts as they appear. Rep these 8 rows throughout.

TENSION

12 sts and 18 rows measure 10cm square over stocking st with 7mm needles and two strands of yarn held together. Take time to check tension before starting work: it is essential to work to the stated tension to achieve success.

INSTRUCTIONS

Note: work using 2 strands of yarn held together. Cast on 52 sts and work as follows: 5 sts in garter st, 16 sts Right Cable, 10 sts in st st, 16 sts Left Cable, 5 sts in g st. When Scarf is 200cm long, cast off all sts loosely. At each end knot about 17 fringes evenly spaced. For each fringe cut 3 strands 35cm long, fold in half and with a crochet hook knot fringe to scarf.

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
